I/We hereby authorize Rabbi Ian Silverman to dispose of all *chametz* that may be in my/our possession wherever it may be– at home, place of work, or elsewhere– in accordance with the requirements of Jewish Law.

Please return to Rabbi Silverman (in his hands) no later than **Sunday, April 4th by 10:30 am** or bring to the Fast of the First Born study session *Torah Siyyum* **Wednesday morning at 7-8:30 am**. The form may also be scanned and sent either to rabbian@aol.com or to office@enjc.org any time prior to 10 am on that date. It is highly recommended that you do so earlier if you know where you will be storing the *chametz* in your home. Please do not rely on the postal service to deliver by a given date unless you send by mail two weeks prior. This will minimize the risk of the form being late. You can also call the Rabbi by telephone and describe all the items on the form.

Ma'ot Hittin

It is customary to contribute to a communal fund before *Pesach* in order that everyone can afford a kosher *Pesach* and to help feed the hungry in our midst. Contributions may be made to the ENJC Rabbi's Fund when you appoint him your agent for the sale of your *chametz*. Rabbi Silverman will be selling these sectors of your domicile to Todd Rapley, our wonderful custodian.

Please note: It is important, when you sell the leavened goods, to move them to an area outside of the kitchen. Only "*Hametzdik*" pots, pans and utensils can be stored (and sealed away) in the kitchen. Food must be stored and sealed away elsewhere in the house and you may not enter that area during Passover. If you must place it in a room in which access is important, it may be cordoned by a partition. The package of food should not be visible.
